Membership Musings

Editor's Note: Although Wayne McKinley was not a current member of the Spirit of St. Louis Region CCCA, he was known and loved in our area for many years. His collection of more than 45 Antique and Full Classic automobiles included a 1933 Auburn V12 Speedster and a 1937 Cord 812 Supercharged Convertible Phaeton. Wayne was also known for his collaboration with Glenn Pray in Oklahoma to produce specially designed 8/10 Cord replicars in the 1960s. He will be missed by many in our area.

William "Wayne" McKinley, 99, lifelong resident of Belleville, passed away peacefully Wednesday evening the 24th of February at the Cedarhurst Nursing Home in Waterloo.

Wayne was preceded in death by his wife of 47 years, Gloria Collis who passed away in Belleville in 2009, two brothers, Dean McKinley of Belleville, William "Bill" McKinley of Florida and a sister, Catherine Hinerman.

Born May 20, 1921 in Freeburg he was the fourth of five children of the late, Lemuel Ransom "L. R." McKinley and Catherine Stevenson McKinley. Shortly after Wayne was born L. R. established one of the first Chevrolet automobile dealerships in Southern Illinois, operated as L.R. McKinley and Sons Incorporated on West Main Street in Belleville from 1921 until 1975. In 1949, Wayne established the satellite dealership known as O'Fallon Motor Co. Inc. in O'Fallon, Illinois selling new and used Chevrolet cars for nearly 55 years from the same location on South Lincoln Avenue.

He was the last surviving, original founder of the Bank of O'Fallon, in O'Fallon, Illinois which he helped to establish in 1959 and was an honorable member of Kiwanis International for 65 years. Wayne was a businessman, a philanthropist, and well-respected member of the communities of Belleville and O'Fallon and was known for his trademark smile and ever-present suit and tie, even underneath his coveralls when working on his antique car collection. He was widely known throughout the United States and worldwide for his love and adventures with antique automobiles. He was a collector's collector who loved to show his collection and share his vast knowledge about early automotive history. He was a friend to all who knew him; kind and generous of his time, his wit, his wisdom, and his possessions and never spoke ill of anyone.




Die Cast Classic Cars in 1/18th

The recent and seemingly ongoing COVID 19 pandemic has made finding other ways to enjoy and appreciate Full-Classic Cars even more important. Model cars of all types is a way to enjoy cars I might or might not ever have since I was nine or ten years old and Classics are no different. Choices are broad and you might find interest in models from 1/64th to 1/18th to large 1/6th scale. We are going to look at some 1/18th scale models here although some are actually a little larger. The difference is not readily noticeable unless they are displayed side by side so I am categorizing them as being the same. These are a few of favorite and more rare models that I hope you enjoy. I have no idea if all of these are still available but they are interesting to study and enjoy in any case.



This is a wonderful model of Gary Coopers SSJ Duesenberg displayed in an open sided box with pictures of Cooper inside. Look closely and you will see that this car is accurately different than the SSJ below that is associated with Clark Gable. Notice the rear fenders, taillights and other details that vary between the cars.



This is a 1/18th scale model of the Duesenberg SSJ that has been associated with Clark Gable. It was owned for years by CCCA member Al Ferrara in Indiana.

Awakening a Sleeping Beauty

It turned out to be a very good thing when National Museum of Transportation Curator Coby Ellison asked us to bring our 1929 Cadillac to the Museum for an upcoming exhibit on Cadillacs. The car has been sleeping quietly in the back corner of our garage since November 1998 and I needed this goal of getting it out to force me to do what I








should have done years ago. When any automobile has been stored for this long there are a number of things that need to be done. A thorough cleaning was a big part of that chore but there can also be surprises. There is no hydraulic system on most cars this old so seized brake cylinders are not a problem but the fuel system will need service, along with tires. Fortunately the clutch was not stuck, as could happen sometimes. I could have never accomplished this job without the generous help of friends Larry Hassel and Stephen Noll whose substantial muscle made pushing vehicles possible. In addition to moving the 5,420 pound Cadillac, we had to push a 4,770 pound Rolls-Royce and a 2,000 pound 1909 Auburn by hand. My 1931 Ford AA truck runs and drives so it moved under its own power. Stephen Noll worked very hard on all of the vehicles and especially hard cleaning the Cadillac. It took everyone, including Myrna to get the car into the trailer in the rain but we made it.


